

STISD FACT SHEET

- Tuition-free
- Serving three counties in RGV Cameron, Hidalgo and Willacy (area of 3,643 sq. mi)
- Seven campuses:
 - o 2 middle schools (grades 6-8)
 - 4 high schools (grades 9-12)
 - 1 virtual school (grades 6-12)
- Open Enrollment: Every student in tri-county area served has an opportunity to enroll (no selection or screening criteria)
- Free bus transportation offered to/from all campuses for all full-day and Half-Day Career & Technical Education Program students
- The only magnet school district in the state and possibly the nation

FINANCE

- School district funding is comprised of 3 revenue sources: local, state, and federal contributions.
- STISD is subject to the same state funding formula as other districts, except other districts receive additional funds not available to STISD.

Funding Priorities for STISD


- Academics are priority for STISD's financial resources.
- STISD does not allocate exorbitant amounts of funding for expenses not related to student performance (i.e. athletics or extracurriculars).
- Tax revenue assists STISD with operating expenses to serve 3 counties, including transportation and programs.

Transparent Construction of Facilities

- STISD uses the "lease revenue bond" method to construct facilities, an option that can be used by all school districts.
- We publish public notices of the intent to secure and construct facilities in each of the 3 county newspapers.
- Without availability of state funding assistance, STISD uses property tax revenue to build, maintain, and renovate facilities.
 - STISD has no Interest & Sinking (I&S) ability, so all costs for facilities are budgeted in Maintenance & Operations (M&O).

Financial Performance

- Earned "Superior Achievement" Rating in Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) Report for 15 years or more
- Received the highest rating of an "unqualified" audit opinion for 15 years or more
- STISD carries a fund balance to operate for 6 months in the event of a disaster, and
 allocates funds for current and future needs in facility improvements, maintenance
 and construction, due to the lack of state support in these areas.

Athletics

- UIL and home school districts previously allowed STISD students to participate in
 UIL athletics through the home district, but over time, home districts stopped
 allowing this for STISD students.
- STISD students and families communicated an interest in an athletic outlet, so STISD met the demand of the student population by providing athletic programs via an alternate avenue.
- STISD's funding for Athletics/Related Activities spent within our region is at <1% of our total budget, as opposed to others who allocate more.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Full 4-year CTE programs of study aligned with a state-approved industry-based certification (IBC)

- No limit to participation: Programs open to all interested students, with no selection criteria or program-specific requirements, unless required by the agency.
- Extended CTE opportunities for students in 7th & 8th grade to begin with Principles courses from 16 programs of study out of the 20 (full 4-year) programs of study available across the district.
- Higher Education partnerships are aligned to STISD vocational and educational

MAGNET SCHOOL

STISD campuses instill a passion for learning and growth with flexible and innovative curriculum centered around themes.

- STEM: Science Academy is a Project Lead the Way (PLTW) "model school" with Master teachers who train new PLTW teachers to teach specific courses.
- Health Science: STISD has offered health science opportunities since 1984, and has expanded certifications to 11 healthcare certifications to better serve the needs of our community.




STISD students historically **perform above average** in SAT & ACT


2022 SAT Average Scores

2022 ACT Average Scores Nation STISD State







SPECIAL PROGRAMS

SPECIAL PROGRAMS GROWTH



STISD's Special Populations enrollment has continued to increase.

HALF DAY PROGRAM [For students receiving special education services in Hidalgo, Cameron, and Willacy districts]

STISD's Half Day Program provides students with Industry Based Certifications (IBC) and other certifications to support their transition plan as developed by the ARD committee at their home district.

- Students who earn an IBC help home districts' Closing the Gaps component of their accountability ratings by showing they are CCMR ready.
- Students who earn other certifications may be considered to have specific employability skills & self-help skills (when graduation code of 55 is used) which in turn also helps their home district and campus CCMR accountability ratings.

All Half Day Program services are provided at **zero cost** to the home school district.
